General Monthly Meeting Minutes

February 16, 2023

Call to Order

Presentation of Speakers

Shera Broussard LaPoint



Shera Broussard LaPoint, also known as, the GENE HUNTER (<u>http://www.thegenehunter.com</u>) is a genetic genealogist with a passion for bringing families together, and helping law enforcement agencies solve crimes as a genetic investigator. She is the founder of The Gene Hunter, LLC, specializing in investigative Genetic Genealogy, biological searches, and DNA assessments. Shera, now a popular lecturer and professional genealogist, has helped solve hundreds of cases reuniting adoptees with their biological families. Shera was noted and praised by the League City, TX Police Department for helping to solve some of the decades-old *Killing Fields* murder cases.

Shera began by defining genetic genealogy, and sharing the benefits of having your DNA tested. She pointed out the different DNA testing companies, and showed how they differ in focus, so anyone interested can make a satisfactory choice. Shera shared *The Family Tree: Guide to DNA Testing and Genetic Genealogy* by Blaine T. Bettinger as a primary resource. After her interesting lecture, she opened the floor to questions and further discussion.
